TEACHABLE MOMENT FORMAT

ANSWERING QUESTIONS

- 1. Reassure the child that it is good to ask questions.
- 2. Find out what the child thinks/is really asking.
- 3. Decide what "messages" you want to give.
- 4. Answer simply, using medical terminology.
- 5. Encourage the child to give you feedback.

RESPONDING TO BEHAVIORS AND COMMENTS

- 1. Decide first if it is better to ignore the situation. If ignoring the situation is inappropriate, then continue with the following steps...
- 2. Name the behavior/comment to the child or children as you see or hear it; praise if appropriate.
- 3. Find out the meaning of the behavior/comment to the child or children.
- 4. Decide what "messages" you want to give.
- 5. Give the messages by responding simply.
- 6. Encourage the child or children to give you feedback.
